- The advanced manufacturing industry in Jefferson County is one
 of the county's largest and fastest growing industries. Industry
 employment in Jeffco increased by 7.4% from 2016 2021,
 outpacing the national growth rate of 0.4%.
- More than 16% of the advanced manufacturing employment in the nine-county region is located in Jefferson County (2022).
- Jefferson County is home to the Colorado School of Mines, which consistently ranks as the #1 engineering school in the nation (2022).
- Jefferson County has a business-friendly environment. To support the business community, the county recently eliminated its portion of the business personal property tax, becoming the first county in Colorado to completely eliminate this tax.
- 48% of the residents in Jefferson County have a bachelor's degree or higher, helping position Colorado as the nation's second most educated workforce (2022).
- Colorado has the 8th highest rate of entrepreneurs (2021).
